Let's play a game! Come to the church on **Friday, May 17, at 6:00 pm** for a group game called Fact or Fiction.

In turn, each person will be asked to give one statement that is true about themselves (fact) and one statement that is false about themselves (fiction). The opposite team will discuss which statement they believe to be true about that person, and the team leader will present the team's guess. If they guess incorrectly, the point goes to the presenting team; if they guess correctly, the point goes to the answering team.

After enjoying the ride and good conversation, we'll arrive at Wallace and be given the opportunity to take a fascinating tour of the Sierra Silver Mine, which includes a round-trip trolley ride that tells history and a tour of Wallace proper. After lunch we'll board the bus again for a short drive to the Polanski Tunnel Trail to stroll on the walking tour. Walk the two-mile trail with trail bosses Del Pope and Dennis Grube, or choose the shorter 1/2 mile walk with Martha Pope and Dick Young. Or stay in the park near the bus and play card games with Cheri Young and Debra Grube.

At 3:00 we'll board the bus for the last time for the ride home, arriving in the church parking lot at around 4:30.
