This indoor farm museum displays machinery and farm artifacts from 1850-1950. Equipment is researched and restored to its original splendor.


Whether you attend the tour or not, meet us for lunch at 11:30 at the northside Olive Garden, reserved under the name of Prime Time.

Life Lesson from Nehemiah: Seek the Lord's Guidance

Nehemiah was given his freedom and allowed to go rebuild Jerusalem's walls. First Chronicles 16:11 says, "Seek the LORD and His strength, seek His face continually." One of the best ways to seek the Lord's guidance is to pray and listen. Prayer is important, not only because it strengthens our relationship with God, but also because it connects us spiritually with Him and the world around us. When you aren't in a committed relationship with God and don't value the importance of prayer, it's easy to get distracted by everything going on in the world around you. When prayers aren't answered the way we want them to be, the conversation easily goes from "we" to "me." But when you routinely pray, and listen to what God is saying, the focus shifts from the personal to the needs of others, and you'll better understand what God is telling you.
